



Why are we here? *And why should you join us?*

BECAUSE SEWANEE OFFERS A RIGOROUS ACADEMIC EXPERIENCE.

WITH A STUDENT-TO-PROFESSOR RATIO OF **10:1** AND AN AVERAGE CLASS SIZE OF **17**, ALL OF OUR MORE THAN **160** FULL-TIME FACULTY MEMBERS (96% HAVE TERMINAL DEGREES IN THEIR FIELDS) REALLY KNOW US.

We offer 38 majors, 44 minors, three certificate programs (**CIVIC AND GLOBAL LEADERSHIP, CREATIVE WRITING, AND WATERSHED SCIENCE**), and five pre-professional programs (**BUSINESS, EDUCATION, ENGINEERING, LAW, MEDICAL AND HEALTH PROFESSIONS**). **60% OF US MAJOR AND MINOR**, and **14% OF US DOUBLE MAJOR**. That 14% is particularly impressive when you consider that 100% of us take comprehensive examinations in our majors (If you double major, you take two).

AMONG SEWANEE'S MOST **POPULAR MAJORS** ARE BIOLOGY, ECONOMICS, ENGLISH, HISTORY, INTERNATIONAL AND GLOBAL STUDIES, NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE ENVIRONMENT, POLITICS, AND PSYCHOLOGY.




FINDING YOUR PLACE

Sewanee has expanded its financial aid program to meet the full demonstrated need of admitted students who qualify for financial aid. For international students, this aid will include a combination of scholarships, grants, and work-study.


