#### POSSIBLE THREAT TO THE CAMPUS COMMUNITY

The university is investigating a report of suspicious activity involving the following described incident, persons and vehicle:

A student was walking on campus and was approached by a vehicle with a driver and three occupants.

The vehicle description is a dark color older model Honda Odyssey.

The driver's approximate age is 40s-50 and reported to be a white male.

Three occupants, also white males, wearing facial coverings from their noses to their chins, with their approximate ages being in their 30s.

The driver stopped the vehicle and asked the student where he was going and the student did not give a location; the vehicle then drove away.

Officers checked the area and were unable to locate the vehicle or it's occupants.
