* ECON 233 must be taken no later than the spring of the junior year. ECON 133 is prerequisite to this course. Students who are interested in graduate school in Economics, Finance, or related disciplines or who wish to pursue honors in the major should complete ECON 233 as early as possible to allow additional time to work on their research.

**ECON 450 is a continuation of ECON 410 (Research Seminar) for students who have applied to complete an honors thesis and been accepted by the department. This course is only required of those who are pursuing honors in the major. Prerequisites: ECON 410, at least two 300-level economics courses and instructor and departmental permission.

† LANG and G6 (or G6XX) courses will be taken in a single foreign language of the student's choice. This plan assumes that students are beginners in foreign language education. Those with language experience in high school may place into higher-level foreign language courses. College general education requirements are: *One 300-level or higher foreign language course OR foreign language through the 200 (3rd semester) level together with one course in a related culture.*
