Employees will also receive a written report on the Regents' meeting. Along with the introduction of new employees, there were also reports on the strategic planning process and from the School of Theology, Student Success, College Admission, and University Relations. And pre-submitted questions were answered.

DEI Office and Initiatives Update

Sibby Anderson-Thompkins has been conducting a listening tour since her arrival in September as vice provost for diversity, equity, and inclusion. She has heard about some of the challenges, opportunities, and aspirations you have for enhancing Sewanee's culture and climate, and our sense of belonging and community. More of you will have the chance to connect with Sibby in the coming weeks. As she establishes a <u>DEI Office</u> here, the roles and responsibilities of two staff members have been expanded. Rachel Fredericks has been appointed as the permanent director of the Office of Multicultural Affairs. She will manage programs and services that support access and enhance the success of diverse students. Sylvia Gray is now the senior director of equity, equal opportunity, and Title IX, and will have oversight of training and awareness efforts related to all forms of harassment and prohibited discrimination as well as the coordination of prompt and equitable investigations and resolution of related complaints. Sylvia

and others will aim to foster a campus environment that is free from inequity, discrimination, and harassment.

Vice-Chancellor Brigety provided an email update on the DEI initiatives he announced last September. Read the <u>original announcement</u> as well as the <u>12-month update</u> sent to campus yesterday.

Strategic Planning

The strategic planning process continues its work around four pillars: 1) elevating diversity, equity, and inclusion; 2) improving student success; 3) curriculum renewal and innovation; and 4) economic development and Domain stewardship.
