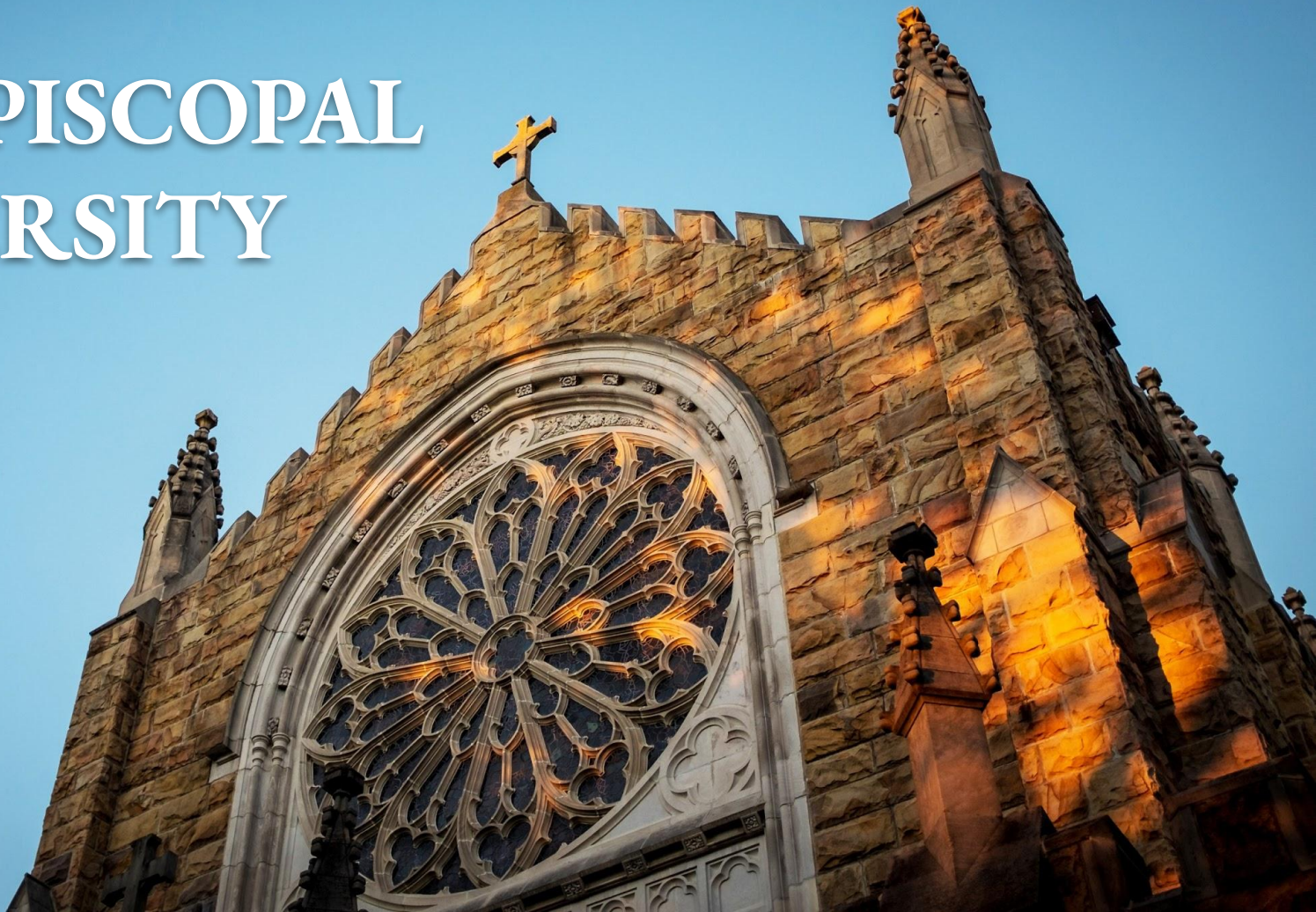

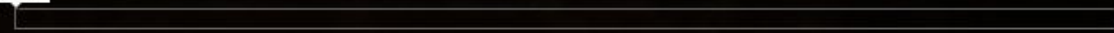

CAMPUS

- 99% of undergraduate students live on campus.
- The Domain: **13,000 acres** of forests, bluffs, meadows, lakes, and caves is a significant research and recreational resource for students and faculty.



CONSTITUENT DIOCESES

The University of the South is the only institution of higher education founded and governed by dioceses of the Episcopal Church. Currently the bishops, clergy, and laity of **27 dioceses** form the core of the University's Board of Trustees providing the support and relationships that make Sewanee such a unique and special place.

UNDERGRADUATE ACADEMICS

- **38** majors, **44** minors, and **15** special programs
 - along with pre-professional programs in business, health/medicine, education, engineering, and law.
- Sewanee has produced **27** Rhodes Scholars, **53** Watson Fellows, **34** NCAA Postgraduate Scholars, and dozens of Fulbright Scholars.
- Graduate school acceptance rates:
 - business **90-95%**
 - law **90-95%**
 - medicine **80-85%** (national average is 42%)
- Student-faculty ratio **10:1**
- Average class size: **17**



THE SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY

FORMING LAY & ORDAINED CHURCH LEADERS

In the Anglican tradition of forming disciples through a **common life of prayer, study, and service**, the seminary offers residential education surrounded by God's creation in a rural, natural setting. The seminary's **rigorous curriculum** is grounded in **tradition**, while also emphasizing development of the **creative capacity** required to take the core activities of the Church—which is to gather, hear the Word, and share the sacraments—and **adapt** them to the changing demands of our time.

SEWANEE'S SPIRITUAL HUB

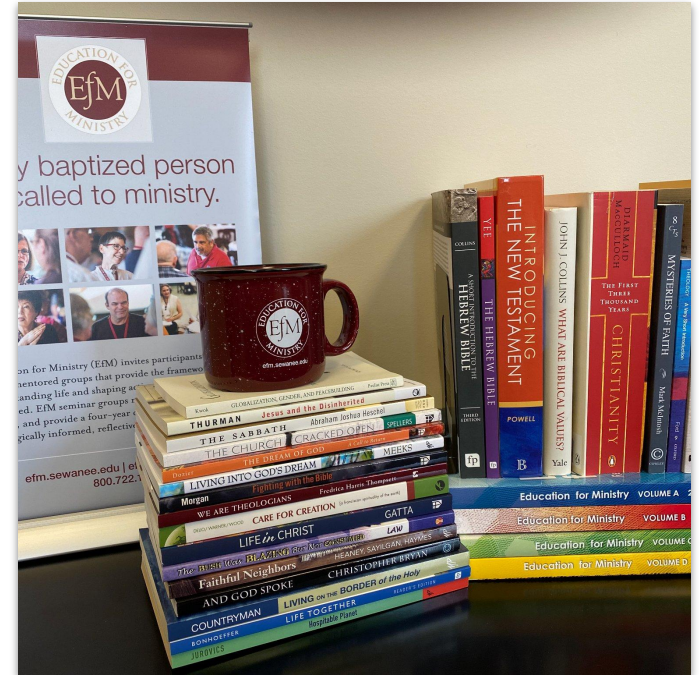
- The Chapel puts the gifts of the Episcopal Church at its best in service of a religiously diverse campus.
- Chaplains connect students to religious communities that will meet their needs, and offer diverse opportunities for Episcopal worship within the Chapel itself.
- A 50+ member University Choir enriches Sunday worship while being open to students of all religious backgrounds
- A large team of chaplains, clergy associates, and seminarians spread across campus mean plenty of caregivers available to listen, connect, and encourage
- Formation offerings create space for students and community members to integrate the life of the spirit with the life of the mind
- In partnership with the Offices of Civic Engagement and Career Readiness, the Chapel encourages reflection on vocation and living with purpose
- All Saints' Chapel is an outward and visible sign of God's beloved community, where belonging and equity intersect



EfM - EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY

THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION & REFLECTION

- EfM is a unique parish-based program of theological education designed to help laypersons become theologically informed and articulate. In small-group settings, participants study scripture, history, and theology; and read and reflect on how God is calling them to work in the world.
- EfM Short Courses will launch in mid-Fall. These courses, intended for a wide audience in congregations, will use EfM small group practices for a brief but deep dive into a focused question concerning the intersection of contemporary life and faith. Two courses will be available by the end of the 2022-2023 academic year; one will be bilingual (Spanish-English). More courses will be developed over the next few years.
- EfM's bilingual (Spanish-English) sister program Educación para la Formación en el Ministerio Laical (EFML) is under development. We hope to have pilot groups forming in this academic year.

THEOLOGICAL DEBATE SOCIETY

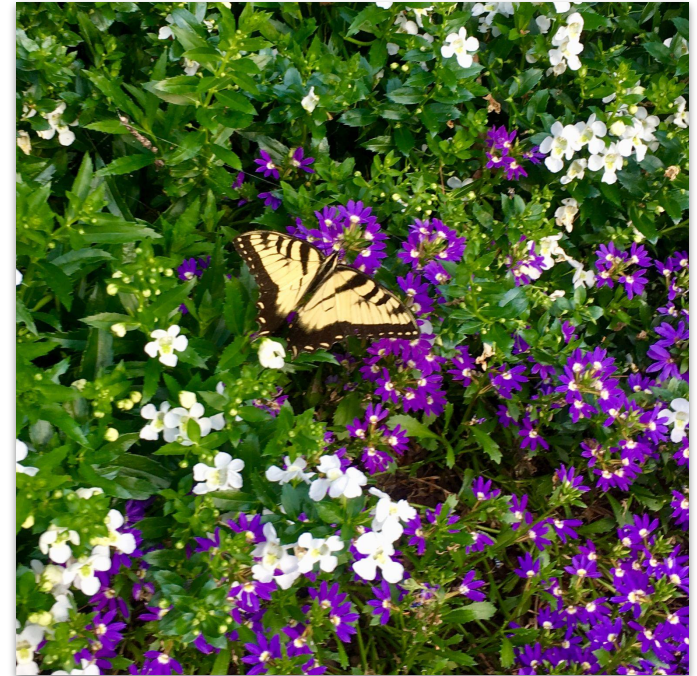
