# What is Title IX and the Sex Discrimination Policy?

Title IX is a federal law that protects everyone from sex discrimination in an educational environment. Together, the Title IX law and the University's Title IX & Sex Discrimination Policy prohibit unwanted acts of a sexual nature regardless of:

- Sex
- Sexual Orientation

- Gender Identity Gender Expression Your Role at Sewanee

This means that under Title IX or the University Policy, you have a right to be free from:

- Unequal treatment in educational programs or activities owned, sponsored, or operated by the University
- Sexual harassment, such as sexual assault, dating or domestic violence, stalking,
- Any other advances, exploitation, abuse, or unwanted misconduct of a sexual nature

We encourage you to report! Remember that many faculty and staff are mandated to report all information about sex discrimination/sexual misconduct to the Title IX Office. The University reviews to all reports. See the Title IX website for information on the process or procedures, such as investigations or informal resolutions.

If you feel that you or someone you know is a victim of sex discrimination, sexual misconduct, or that there has been a violation of the Title IX and Sex Discrimination Policy, please contact:

While reporting to a healthcare professional is confidential, the medical staff is obligated to notify law enforcement when injuries are life threatening or if injuries result from the use of a weapon

(T.C.A. § 38-1-101).

You may report to any University mandated reporter such as faculty, staff, lay persons working in the Chaplain's office, or student leaders such as proctors, FYP mentors, PRE Mentors, SOP Ambassadors, or orientation leaders.
